Walking with Jesus with Pastor Eric Spivey

In the middle of July, First Baptist Cornelia and Cornelia United Methodist Church will partner together to host a Community Vacation Bible School. Kids from throughout Habersham County will gather in our gym for the opening sessions, will have snacks in the Fellowship Hall of CUMC, and will enjoy recreation on a closed down Oak Street. This VBS partnership began in 2015 when both churches realized we can hold a better Bible School together than we can apart. Through this shared ministry, we have established strong relationships with each other.

Our VBS illustrates the importance of partnerships in our ministry at FBC. Partnerships allow our church and other churches to find new ways to work together for the Kingdom of God. For First Baptist Cornelia, partnerships have expanded our ministry presence in the community and world. For example –

- We partner with the Department of Families and Community Services (DFACS) in our ministry with Camp Agape.
- We partner with the Red Cross in our Cold Weather Shelter.
- We partner with Cornelia Elementary School to impact children in our community.
- We partner with ESOL organizations like North Georgia Tech and Volunteers in Literacy to provide English classes in our community.
- We partner with other churches to feed people through the soup kitchen.

One of the most significant and growing partnerships in which our church engages is our Santa Emilia, Nicaragua Partnership. Lots of churches around the country send short term mission teams to Latin America every year. Here is a short list about what makes our Santa Emilia Partnership stand out from the rest and be truly transformative both in Nicaragua and Cornelia.

In the spring of 1974 when Dr. Emmett Henderson was pastor, First Baptist held a Mission Conference. In one session, Mrs. Irene Swaim, director Habersham County Department of Family and Children's Services, spoke.

She told how their agency provided the essentials, such as shelter, food, clothing, and medical provisions for the children living in the foster homes under their care. Mrs. Swaim then stated "The thing the agency could not provide for the children was the love they needed, which is also a very essential element in their lives." She said, too, that there was no provision for the children under their care to enjoy summer camps the way many other children did.

That night the seed was planted; it took root in the mind and heart of two church members; and Camp Agape was born! It has been nurtured, sometimes pruned, but through the years it has grown until it is the heart beat of what the church strives to be "Loving the world as God loves us."

Jennie Swindler says "John and I have been a part of ministry all our married life. Little did we know when we came to First Baptist, Cornelia, we would be exposed to Camp Agape and all the wonderful people and spiritual giants who have made it a success in the church and community for over 40 years. Our family has been blessed to have been a part of Camp Agape in many areas, including serving as director, serving on the Agape Committee, counselor and counselor-in-training."

FBC CORNELIA NICARAGUA PARTNERSHIP


Almost 40 years ago God began to call me to missions in various ways, but I didn't recognize or acknowledge it. Finally in 2001 I felt His call in a way I couldn't ignore and went with Kris, our son, to Nicaragua with a group from Nebraska.

Over the next few years I went with my other children and Tammy to Honduras and Mexico. On a trip to Honduras I learned through another team member about an organization working in Nicaragua and realized that God was calling us specifically to Nicaragua. Since 2006 we have been taking teams from FBC Cornelia to work in partnership with FBC Matagalpa.

2016 begins our second decade of working in Matagalpa. Since 2015 we have been concentrating our work in Santa Emilia where FBC Matagalpa sponsors a congregation: Congregacion Ebenezer. We are now building the same kind of close relationships in Santa Emilia. This year also marked the beginning of a health worker project in Santa Emilia where we are helping to train and supply some volunteer workers in that community to screen for hypertension and diabetes. Over the years we have moved forward and sometimes backward as we have attempted to follow God's calling. In our humanness we have made mistakes, but we have also seen clear evidence of God's hand at work. We are reminded that we serve a very patient God who will bring forth fruit in its season. SPOTLIGHT ON THE SEEKERS CLASS - Every Sunday morning at 9:45 am (or so!) we have many options for adults to choose from for Bible study. During the next few weeks, the Seekers class, which meets in room 307 on the third floor of the Family Ministry Center, will be going through a study called "Christianity, Cults, and Religions". This is a six session study which they began on June 26. If you are interested in learning more about what other faiths believe and we can respond as Christians, then please plan to sit in with this class. They will examine essential Christian doctrine, and look at the beliefs and history of Jehovah's Witnesses, Mormonism, Eastern Spiritual beliefs (Hinduism, Buddhism and New Age), and Islam. SABBATICAL POLICY

One of the big questions about Sabbaticals is how does it work?

The FBC Cornelia Sabbatical policy is designed to provide our ministers an opportunity for physical rest, spiritual renewal, and professional development. The Senior Pastor is eligible to submit a Sabbatical Leave Plan after completion of every six years of continuous service and at least 9 months before the expected leave dates. Sabbatical leave can be for a period of up to 12 weeks.

The minister's Sabbatical Leave plan will be submitted to the personnel committee and must be approved by the deacons. This plan will include: a plan of study, benefits of such study to the individual and the church, length of requested leave, plan for covering job responsibilities during the leave, and any other helpful information such as possible external funding sources. The Associate Pastor shall assume the pastoral duties of the Senior Pastor during his absence with the desire to hire a part time sabbatical pastor to help cover proclamation and pastoral responsibilities.

Once the sabbatical plan is approved, the deacon chair will appoint a sabbatical team made up of a currently serving deacon, a member of the personnel committee and 2 members at large. The team will work with the pastor and church both in preparation for and during the sabbatical leave.

- 1. Long Team Commitment:** Our 2016 mission trip marked the beginning of our second decade of ministry in Matagalpa, Nicaragua area and our 2nd year in our Santa Emilia Partnership.
- 2. Partnership with Nicaraguans:** Our partnership ministry in Santa Emilia is built on the ongoing, weekly ministry of members from First Baptist Church, Matagalpa (about 15 miles away). Each week, members of this church travel to Santa Emilia, teach the Bible, lead worship, and minister to the community.
- 3. Partnership with Missionary Ventures:** Short term mission trips are all the rage, but without long term, cross cultural missionaries like Brenda Rose, who know both cultures, partnerships tend to become very patronizing. Brenda and her team from Missionary Ventures do all the heavy lifting to make sure each mission trip goes off smoothly.
- 4. Community Focused:** By working in one community – Santa Emilia – God has begun to open more doors for relationships, ministry and community development. We are now beginning to see coordinated efforts from different ministries to work together for the sake of Santa Emilia. This year, our team helped train 3 new community health workers who will be working throughout the year with the patients we saw this June.
- 5. Relationships:** One of our teenagers on this year's team said it best. "I want to go back to Nicaragua because I feel like all the people there are my family." Our work in Santa Emilia continues to grow the relationships between Cornelia and those communities. It is these relationships and God's grace that keep pulling us all back.

Each of these partnerships has an opportunity for you to serve, minister and impact others in the name of Jesus. As you hear us talk about VBS this month, let me invite you to say a word of pray over each of these partnerships and the work of the sacred partners of First Baptist Cornelia.

Finally

At the end of the month, my family and I will be on vacation. We will spend some time relaxing on a beach and working around the house before the school and work calendar begins in full in August. I'm grateful to serve as your pastor and look forward to another great year of ministry ahead of us. Pastor John Swindler and our deacons will be ready to serve you while we are away.


