stories about life on the urban East Atlanta farm – colorful tales of sharing space with homeless people, chickens, sheep, and goats. Also while in seminary, he worked with the refugee community in Clarkston, Georgia. Through the local church he helped new residents understand their mail, and that "Americans don't – or shouldn't - eat hamburgers at every meal," among other daily tasks. These experiences shaped Nathan's view of the Gospel. "I think that is what God has called us to do, find people in the neighborhoods where they are and love them to Christ," he said. Nathan is currently doing his doctoral research at Mercer University in becoming a disciple – making God's love guide our lives.

Going to seminary cost Nathan his long-time girlfriend who "didn't want to be married to a pastor." But while working on staff as an interim youth and college minister at FBC Gainesville, the church secretary set him up on a blind date with a pretty, young teacher. Nathan had a plan. First, they would meet for coffee at Inman Perk in downtown Gainesville; if it went well, he would ask her to walk down the street to a restaurant for dinner. Hours later Nathan and Kristen were still at the restaurant.

The couple continued to date even while Nathan moved to South Georgia to lead FBC Claxton in 2017. Kristen continued teaching kindergarten at Enota Elementary in Gainesville. She joined him in 2018 after they married. Nathan says Kristen's role in his ministry is very important. "Kristen helps me be more loving and grace-filled," said Nathan. "She has one of the biggest hearts I've ever seen."

Nathan, now 33, has a big heart for people too: "My wife says I could talk to a tree." Church members, local leaders, homeless, and outcasts all have Nathan's cell number. He said: "I let them know I am somebody here to help them."

Nathan and Kristen look forward to beginning their ministry together at FBC Cornelia. One of Nathan's goals - post-COVID - is getting people back to church. "People forget that they are loved. When I do home visits, you find out pretty quick people are hungry for love. My goal has been, that they are reminded they are loved by the church and the church is actively loving them."



Please be in prayer for our Youth Ministry as we seek God's direction for our future; and pray for Dustin and Chelsea Biggers and their family as they move into new ministry opportunities. We appreciate Dustin's faithful service during this time of transition over the last two years. Members of the Youth Committee will be filling in to lead our youth on Sunday mornings during the Sunday School hour and on Wednesday nights for Youth Group. We are prayerfully considering next steps as we search for the right person to lead our middle and high school students.

FBC Calls the Rev. Nathan LaShoto as Senior Pastor

In a unanimous yes vote, First Baptist Church Cornelia called the Rev. Nathan LaShoto as senior pastor on February 27. Nathan's first Sunday in the pulpit as FBC's new pastor will be Easter Sunday, April 17.

Nathan LaShoto (pronounced la-show-toe) savs much of his world view was shaped by growing up in White County attending a Southern Baptist Church and spending summers at Woodlands Christian Camp in Cleveland.

where he would wash dishes, set up games and "work behind the scenes."

That idvllic world view was rocked when he left home at 18 to attend the United States Merchant Marine Academy in Kings Point, New York, seeking the opportunity to travel the world and make good money. He turned 19 on a ramshackle container ship loaded with grain and weaponry bound for the Philippines. The ship was filled with rough guys who didn't get along, who were "obsessed" with red-light districts in exotic ports of call.

Nathan says he thought, "There is

no light in this at all." He admits, "I had a crisis of faith." He spent a lot of off-duty time in his room and talked frequently to his mentor Will Dyer, now the senior pastor of FBC Augusta,

Georgia. Dyer told him, "You know God gave you a church to handle the darkness of the world. You don't have to do - find people in the handle it alone."

Nathan left the academy and thought about the ministry. "I don't have to have an exciting life. I just want to love on people." He transferred to the University of North

Georgia with the intention of being a high school physics teacher. "One day it hit me like a ton of bricks that I could go to seminary."

After graduating from UNG in 2011 Nathan went to work for American Sites, a company that builds cell phone towers, while continuing to pray through the seminary idea. In 2013, he enrolled at Emory University's Candler School of Theology and worked on a nearby Mennonite farm, which provided income and lodging for the young seminarian. He has interesting
