In June, we arrived on the field, excited and thrilled to be here in service and ministry. I preached my first sermon on July 4th!

I still remember that moment when I first sat in the chair in the pastor's office. Here is part of my prayer from my first day:

June 28, 2010, 9:00 am, Pastor's Study, First Baptist Church, Cornelia, Georgia

"O Lord, Thank you! I'm here today with the fullness of Your affirmation and love. I feel your smile. Life will be good here. Not always easy, but good. May the lifelong lesson of trust you have walked me through teach me how to lead others to trust you too! Give me guidance each day as you form me into the pastor and person you desire for me. Amen"

This prayer still guides me each day. Our 7 years together have not always been easy, but they have been good. We have witnessed the Spirit of God at work. We have seen individuals accept and follow Jesus. We have seen individuals and groups commissioned and sent out into the world to advance God's Kingdom. We have grown as disciples of Jesus. We have worshipped week after week experiencing God together. We have deeply loved each other and the world even when we were not that loveable.

FBC MISSION PARTNER

One of our key FBC Mission partners in Matagalpa, Nicaragua, is Brenda Rose, an American Missionary with Missionary Ventures. Brenda coordinates our mission team logistics from the time we arrive in Managua to the time we leave. Her medical expertise facilitates all of the red tape we must maneuver to get our medical team and our medicine to our clinics.

Along with organizing our team and many others, Brenda runs a Re-Nutrition Center between Matagalpa and Santa Emilia. This medical center receives extremely under nourished children and works to bring them back to health. Our mission team will visit the center on Sunday, June 4th. Below is an update about the center:

"I always thought that when I turned 62 or 63 that I would start to slow down in the ministry. I have a wonderful family that is prepared to take over and they are doing lots to help me. Well, God had other things in mind for me. Since I had to make some changes at the center and clinic I had to take over my new position as director.

We had a period of around 5 months that we didn't receive funding from an organization that has been helping the center with a significant amount. Thanks to all of you who answered the call to help the center keep moving forward.

I want to share with you what Adriana is doing now. This photo of Adriana was taken in March 2013. We weren't sure that she would make it. She could hardly walk and was severely malnourished. Slowly but surely she recovered. Her mother got a job at the center washing clothes and Adriana continued to improve. Now four years later she is a beautiful young lady. She is in school and also studying English."

Tuesday: The neighbors and friends who come to the clinic today.


Wednesday: Our FBC Matagalpa friends who serve beside us each day

A WORD from Pastor John:

June is the month that we celebrate dad’s on Father’s Day June 18. Here are some interesting facts about Father’s Day:

- According to Hallmark, Father's Day is the fourth-largest card-sending occasion with 74 million cards given every year.
- Sonora Louise Smart Dodd of Spokane, Wash., is credited with starting Father's Day after hearing a sermon on Mother's Day. Dodd wanted to honor her father William Jackson Smart, a widower who raised six children on his own. The first Father’s Day was held June 19, 1910.
- In 1966, Lyndon B. Johnson, through an executive order, designated the third Sunday in June as the official day to celebrate Father’s Day. However, it wasn’t until 1972, during the Nixon administration, that Father’s Day was officially recognized as a national holiday.

Now, for some theological thoughts from me and from the Scriptures: Dad’s can set, and SHOULD set, the spiritual temperature of the home. We all know that sometimes this is not the case. One of my favorite passages about the importance of fatherhood is this: Ephesians 6:1-4 "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. "Honor your father and mother"—which is the first commandment with a promise—"so that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth." Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord."

Dads, we have a HUGE responsibility given to us in this verse, to bring up the children that God has given us in the training and instruction of the Lord. Let me encourage you today to DO WHAT THE BIBLE INSTRUCTS US TO DO! We are here to help you do this in many ways. Some examples: Weekly Bible study to help YOU grow in your own walk with the Lord.... you can’t give your children what you don’t have! If you are not involved in weekly Bible study, please join us here on Sunday mornings at 9:45 am. Monthly Men’s Ministry meetings, usually the first Sunday of the month starting with breakfast at 8:00 am – Our June meeting will be June 4. David Foster does an excellent job of bringing speakers that always impact my life. If you have not been, come join us this month, (no meetings in July and August). Pastor Eric and I are always available for one on one time to help you grow in your walk with the Lord. Feel free to give us a call and we will do what we can to help you be the spiritual leader in your home that God has designed you to be. Let Father’s Day 2017 be a time where you make a fresh commitment to the Lord and to your family to be a spiritual leader and to leave a LEGACY that will last for generations to come!

Creativity
is a reflection of the
character of God.



From the opening pages of Scripture, we encounter God's creativity in action. With words, "Let there be light", the poem of creation unfolds as light gives way to time, oceans and mountains form, galaxies are set in motion, and the earth is filled with birds, fish, and every creature imaginable. But God is not finished creating. God decided that He wanted His image to populate the earth. He created people in His image to take care and develop His magnificent creation. Humans are unique in that we reflect God in how we interact with each other and the world around us. We may not form mountains and oceans, but we create art and music, build cities, solve problems, and innovate technology—all of which starts with our God-given creativity.

Jesus showed us creativity in action.

When Jesus arrived on planet earth to fulfill God's plan to rescue humanity, that same creativity was evident in every interaction we read throughout Scripture. Through stories, Jesus could explain something difficult or confusing about the Kingdom of God. With unconventional materials, Jesus healed the sick and hurting. With the right question, He could point to His disciples and the **religious leaders what is most important to God. Throughout His earthly ministry, Jesus showed us the difference we can make in the world through creativity.**

We think it's important for us to help our kids and families discover more about Creativity—imagining what you could do because you are made in God's image.

In Psalm 139:14, we read, How you made me is amazing and wonderful. I praise you for that (NlrV). Through this Psalm, David acknowledges God's continued provision for his life. Being created in God's image, means that we are special compared to the rest of creation. We reflect God in amazing and wonderful ways.

As we help kids discover more about God's creativity, we head to the beginning—Genesis—and learn more about God's creativity in the creation of the world.
