FBC FOCUSES MISSION EFFORT IN SANTA EMILIA

"Walking by faith and not by sight." 11
Corinthians 5:7



Under the leadership of Rhett and Tammy Weaver, First Baptist Church, Cornelia has sent Mission Teams to Matagalpa, Nicaragua since 2006. Partnering with the First Baptist Church there, we have developed a very meaningful relationship.

In 2014 a "Vision Team" working with Missionary Ventures and FBC, Matagalpa prayerfully sought God's will about continuing the work already in progress, this included Vacation Bible School, needed medical care, and building up congregations

Beginning in 2015 we focused our work on the mountain village of Santa Emilia. FBC, Matagalpa already had a vibrant and growing mission congregation there. As we worked together we realized one thing was necessary – a suitable facility for this church family to worship. Because of your giving the facility can be completed!

When our 2018 Mission Team goes in June we will worship and provide a medical clinic in this completed church. This is a testimony of our bond in Christ leading us to partner and minister together.

GIVING TO MISSIONS IN 2017

Because of your faithful giving to the FBC Ministry and Mission Budgets in 2017 the Mission Council paid all the Anticipated Mission Investments, this includes our Denominational Partners, First Baptist Missions, Community Missions, our Local and Global Partnerships, and Denominational Mission Offerings. Through the Mission Grant Fund we gave eight Mission Grants. This included the unforeseen divesting hurricanes and was distributed through the Georgia Baptist Disaster Relief. Your Mission Council also had enough funds to help complete the Santa Emilia Temple, a mission church of our partner First Baptist Church, Matagalpa, Nicaragua. The name of the congregation is Congregacion Ebenezer. In Nicaragua they always refer to the church building as the "temple."

At this time in history, so many churches do not sense the need to work with other churches joined together to Advance God's Kingdom. We are grateful First Baptist, Cornelia has the vision and foresight to joins with others as we become "Laborers together with God." I Corinthians 3:9.

Thanks to your generosity, First Baptist Cornelia ended 2017 wonderfully. The church received over \$102,000 towards our Ministry Operating Budget, the best month of giving this century. As a result, our Ministry Operating Budget ended the year in the positive.

In 2017, the church increased its giving by 5% to our Ministry Operating Budget and 3.3% in total (giving to both the operating budget and the Unified Mission Offering) over 2016. This giving aligns perfectly with our 2018 budget.

3. The Church is the people—not the building.

Every week the Church goes to work. We have to stop compartmentalizing life into “spiritual activities” and “work activities.” Church leaders and business people must work together if we are truly going to see millions of business people unleashed on mission for God.

4. Work impacts our perspective of God.

Regardless of our age or position, everyone is impacted directly by the workplace. Our attitude and perspective on work bleeds into how we treat our spouse, our kids, and ultimately our understanding of God. If we work 45 hours per week for 45 weeks a year for 45 years, that’s 91,125 hours spent at work. The sheer amount of time we spend at work will impact our view of life.

5. God uses work to impact communities.

In addition to providing a place to exercise our individual calling, God uses business and work to serve communities. Productive work affects other people. God’s design for work isn’t simply that people will earn a paycheck, but that society will benefit from healthy business.

6. All of life can be worship.

Many people associate worship simply with music, but it’s so much bigger. In every attitude, action, and relationship we can demonstrate the worth that God is due—that’s worship. In the context of work, we can worship God in a variety of ways: through obeying God’s command to steward His creation; through our attitude, ethics, and excellence in our job; through leveraging resources to generously serve those in need; through sharing our faith with co-workers. Ultimately all of our “work as worship” is for the purpose of glorifying God and sharing Jesus in word and deed with those who don’t know Him.

7. We don’t work to earn God’s favor.

In God’s economy, it’s not what you can do for God, it’s what He does through you. The business culture can be so performance-based that it’s tempting to transfer that mind-set into our relationship with God.

8. Work as worship, but don’t worship work.

While we can worship through our work, we must not worship our work. Our identity is not ultimately in our job but in Christ. Our work is a God-given opportunity to care for our families, fulfill our calling and bring glory to God.

It’s going to be a great event. I hope to see you and your friends on February 23.
