Unified Mission Offering Q & A

What is the Unified Mission Offering?

The Unified Mission Offering is a single, all year, above-tithe mission offering that supports ALL of the mission endeavors and denominational offerings of First Baptist Cornelia.

What is the Purpose of the Unified Mission Offering:

To fuel our vision to love the world as God loves us and to provide structure for funding our missional value of advancing God's kingdom.

Why have a Unified Mission Structure?

It enables more money to be invested in missions. It empowers FBCC to act missionally in the world in the ways God leads us. It provides more flexibility to invest our mission offerings. It gives us the best structure for supporting and engaging missions.

How does the Unified Mission Offering work?

Each month, every church member has two ways to give to the church: The weekly Tithe Ministry Operating Budget Offering and the monthly Unified Mission Offering. The Tithe ministry offering supports the entire work of the church: missions, worship, discipleship, ministries, personnel, and facilities. We vote on an annual Ministry Operating Budget each November.

Along with the Ministry Operating Budget, each member is invited to make an above-tithe offering to missions through the Unified Mission Offering. This gift can be made weekly, monthly, quarterly or even annually. All money given to this offering will be invested in mission work at home and around the world. Offering envelopes are found in the annual offering envelope box, pew racks, and can be given online at www.fbccornelia.org - About - Giving - Online Giving button.

Who manages the Unified Mission Investment Plan?

The First Baptist Cornelia Mission Council manages the Unified Mission Investment Plan. Nominated by the Committee on Committees and confirmed by a vote of the church, the Mission Council's purpose is to lead First Baptist Cornelia in advancing the Kingdom of God. In communication with the Budget/Stewardship/Finance Committee and the deacons, the Mission Council submits this Mission Investment Plan to the church each year to guide the investments of the Mission Fund.

The CBF Offering for Global Missions is the primary source of support ensuring the long-term presence of field personnel around the world - funding salaries, benefits, housing costs and children's educational needs - in their efforts to be the presence of Christ in the most impoverished and threatened communities around the world.

2022 Community Missions: \$19,854

FBC invests money in local community partners to advance God's kingdom in Habersham County through the following organizations:

Habersham Christian Learning Center: Provides teaching in Bible and character through elective courses at Habersham Central High School.

*Sharing and Caring: Provides food, clothing and bill assistance for those in need. During the pandemic the benevolence committee decided to discontinue directly disbursing benevolence funds. They directed that the accumulated funds in the benevolence checking account would be donated to Sharing and Caring. That transfer process began in monthly installments in late 2021 and will be completed in 2022.

Grace Gate: Provides medical care for the uninsured members of our community.

The Lord's Help Soup Kitchen: Provides basic meals and friendship in our community. Gideons International: Provide Bibles locally and around the world to advance God's kingdom.

Hub of Habersham: Habersham United Believers (HUB) serves as a catalyst for Christ-centered ministries in our community. Presently it's main focus is providing school mentors through *Teach One To Lead One* in our Middle and High Schools.

Family Resource Center: The mission of the non-profit organization is to prevent child abuse and nurture children by strengthening families and breaking the cycle of family violence through education and counseling.

Circle of Hope: The mission of the private, non-profit, domestic violence agency is to support, empower and bring hope to those affected by domestic violence through advocacy, awareness, education and community partnerships.

Each year FBC invests heavily in money and volunteer efforts in two local/global mission partnerships. These partnerships help us tell the world about God's love and transform everyone who participates.

Nicaragua Mission:

Since 2006 we have been partnering with First Baptist Church Matagalpa, Nicaragua and Missionary Ventures to serve in the community of Santa Emilia and other rural communities surrounding Matagalpa by providing medical clinics and Bible school.

Cornelia Elementary School:

FBC is a partner with Cornelia Elementary. Since 1999 we have conducted a Prayer Walk for safety at Cornelia Elementary. This year we provided backpacks filled with basic school supplies for needy children. We provide teacher appreciation gifts for school staff throughout the year.

2022 FBC Mission Grants

\$10,000

FBC's Mission Grant program allows us to be flexible, timely and responsive in how we invest our mission dollars! It allows us to help individuals and groups (in and out of our church) answer God's call to serve Him by serving others. Of anyone requesting a mission Grant we ask this simple question: "How will this missional investment help First Baptist Church to 'love others as God loves us'?" Last year our mission grants helped buy oxygen tanks for COVID patients in India, built a playground for a feeding center in Nicaragua, assisted Muslim refugees in Antwerp Belgium, reached out through resort ministry in the Smoky Mountains, and provided support for the Family Resource Center in our own county.



Norcross, Georgia-based Asian Indian Ministries (AIM), with the help of individuals and churches, including FBC Cornelia, purchased oxygen cylinders to help individuals severely affected by COVID-19 in India. The grant from FBC came from our UMOF Mission Grant monies.
