Lenten Fitness Journey Finished at First Baptist 5K

Sara Boyer is not a runner.

But she surprised her family and friends by signing up for First Baptist Church's 5K & Bunny Hop on Saturday, April 8.

"I literally typed 'Easter 5K' in (a Google search) and this popped up," said Boyer, who drove from Woodstock, Ga., to participate in the soggy event on April 8. Her family and friends came to cheer her on as she crossed the finished line - along with 27 other brave runners and walkers - soaked but victorious.

She said, "The rain kind of slowed me down, but that was OK." It was Boyer's first-ever 5K and culminated a Lenten fitness journey that began in February when she decided to join a gym. Having never really exercised before, she began working with a trainer at Wellstar Kennestone Hospital in Marietta, where she is employed as a Certified Nursing Assistant.

"I wanted to be a patient advocate," she said, "but I couldn't tell my patients to eat healthy and exercise if I wasn't doing it. My job is strenuous, and I wanted to be more physically fit."

In September 2022, Boyer started cutting calories and eating healthier, adding cardio to her routine in February. She has lost 50 pounds in six months.

At 27 Boyer has survived three battles with cancer, but her doctor was concerned about heart disease if she didn't get control of her weight and eating habits. There is a history of heart disease and obesity in her family, but she intends to overcome those challenges with her new healthy lifestyle. Boyer's journey has been both physical and spiritual. "Jesus died for our sins and gave us all this power and joy! By putting my faith in God, I can do anything I set my mind to," she said.



"We can create positive energy, healthy habits, conversations with meaning, and we can create moments that help others and provide joy.
