## **Unified Mission Offering Q&A**



## What is the Unified Mission Offering?

The Unified Mission Offering Fund (UMOF) supports ALL of the mission and denominational endeavors at FBC. Your above-tithe gifts and special offerings make up this fund. In addition, approximately 3% of FBC's Ministry Budget is given monthly to the UMOF. This is voted on in the annual Ministry Operating Budget each November.

## What is the *purpose* of the Unified Mission Offering?

To fuel our vision to love the world as God loves us, and to provide a structure for funding missions giving at FBC.

## Why have a Unified Mission structure?

It enables more money to be invested in missions.
It empowers FBC to act missionally in the world, in the ways
God leads us. It provides more flexibility to invest our mission
offerings. It gives us the best structure for supporting and engaging
missions.

## **How** does the Unified Mission Offering work?

You have two ways to support missions at FBC: the weekly Tithe Ministry Budget Offering and the monthly Unified Mission Offering envelopes. The tithe ministry offering supports the entire work of the church: missions, worship, discipleship, ministries, personnel, and facilities. In addition to the Ministry Budget, you are invited to make an above-tithe offering to missions through the UMOF. This gift can be made weekly, monthly, quarterly, or annually. All money given to the UMOF will be invested in mission work at home and around the world.

Offering envelopes are found in your annual offering envelope box or in the pew racks. Or, you may give online at www.fbccornelia.org - About- Giving - Online Giving.

## Who manages the UMOF Investment Plan?

The Missions Committee manages the Unified Mission Investment Plan. The Missions Committee is nominated by the Committee on Committees and confirmed by a church vote.

The Missions Committee communicates with the Stewardship, Budget & Finance Committee and the deacons to create the Mission Investment Plan (outlined in this document), to guide the investments of the UMOF.

2023 FBC Mission Grants

Investment Goal: \$9,000

FBC's Mission Grant Program allows us to be flexible, timely and responsive in how we invest our mission dollars! It allows us to help individuals and groups (in and out of our church) answer God's call to serve Him by serving others. If anyone requests a Mission Grant, we ask this simple question: "How will this missional investment help FBC 'love others as God loves us'?" Last year we provided grants for relief efforts in Mayfield, Kentucky after a devastating tornado, and assisted our children's department with a back-to-school ministry in our local community.
