For Sandy Whaples, teaching the Bible and developing a love for God's word is everything in children's ministry.

"When a kid has been in a class where you have created an excitement about the greatest story ever told and I hear about it – it's like a gold deposit in the bank for me," said Sandy. "It's the highest glory."

With more than 20 years' experience in children and family ministry, Sandy counts recruiting, developing, training, and appreciating volunteers as one of the most enjoyable aspects of ministry.

First Baptist will vote on the recommendation of Sandy Whaples as the new Director of Children and Families in a Called Church Conference during the worship service on Sunday, September 3. Sandy earned her Bachelor of Arts in Education from West Virginia State University in her home state. She began her career teaching preschool. She met her husband Shannon at church one Sunday. He was a flirt. "He kept pursuing me," said Sandy and she finally went out with him. The couple have been married for 34 years. They have two adult children and one granddaughter.
