

The story of Jonah is one of the most beloved Bible stories we have. Many people who are not even religious are familiar with Jonah, the prophet who ran from God and was swallowed by a giant whale. But there is much more to Jonah's story than many of us realize. Jonah, a name which means "love being sent out" wants to hold back his love and God's love from his enemies, the people of Nineveh. He is grumpy, disappointed, suicidal, and yet God is with him through each storm and time in isolation. Even in the belly of the whale, Jonah could not escape God's love and mercy.
